Course Description: Advanced study of English grammar from various perspectives. Introduction of study methods needed for pursuing a degree at an American college.

Course Objectives: Upon completion of this course, students should be able to demonstrate:

- 1. An understanding of what grammar and why it is important.
- 2. An understanding of English grammar and its application.
- 3. The ability to use accurate English grammar and to correct ungrammatical features.
- 4. An understanding and practical use of study methods (not limited to that of grammar) introduced in the course.

Course Requirement: Classes will take the form of lectures and discussion of key topics. Students are required to attend all classes and to complete all assignments prior to each class in order to ensure participation in class discussion. The course will be highly collaborative, and active participation is essential. Students are expected to arrive on time, refrain from leaving prior to the end of the class (except with permission of instructor), and participate in class activities and discussions.

Students with Difficulties: Students with any type of difficulties in their lives (eg. Culture shock, health issues, personal problems, etc.) who need reasonable assistance in this course should promptly direct their request to the course instructor.
